We are going to pay attention to the beginning and the ending of our church year and to each of the Sabbaths - the Sundays of our liturgical calendar and the seasons they observe.

Sunday before last we told the story the Ten Best Ways to Live upstairs in our children's worship room. One of the ten best ways to live is: Keep the Sabbath holy, to rest and remember the gifts of Creation. Each of the 52 cubes or blocks in our wooden puzzle corresponds to a Sunday, a Sabbath, a holy day.
